Main purpose of the volunteer role

Main responsibilities and roles available

- Checking use by dates; ensuring all items are in date.
- Ensuring things are fit for purpose for the cupboard e.g. ensuring item is acceptable for cupboard.
- Supporting promotion of the community cupboard to students.
- Moving donations from storage to the community cupboard.
- Stock take; monitoring and counting how many items we receive and what these items are.

General duties

- Working with food equality staff and external project partners to maintain and further develop the scope of our community gardens.
- Working alongside fellow volunteers to maintain and support developing the community garden.
- Contribute positively to the community meet ups and welcome in other members.
- Share thoughts and ideas around developments that could be made to the garden.
- Contribute to completion of tasks available
- Checking correspondence from the Food Equality Project team to stay connected and active in our volunteer network.
- Be responsible for yourself and other safety when working on the cupboard or university premises
