Contract Length	Confirm the start and end dates of the contract.			
Break Clauses	Check for break clauses in case you need to leave early.			
Rent Amount & Payment	Verify rent amount, due dates, and ask if there any penalties for late payments.			
Bills Included	Ask if utilities (gas, electricity, water, internet) are included in the rent.			
TV License	Determine whether you'll need to purchase a TV license for live TV/BBC iPlayer.

Who Are the Other Tenants?	Meet your potential housemates and ensure you're compatible.			
Living Preferences	Discuss expectations for cleaning, bills, noise, and guests.			
Maximum Occupancy	Confirm the number of tenants allowed in the house and guest policies.

Distance to Campus	Ensure the property is within a convenient distance from the university.			
Local Amenities	Check for nearby shops, gyms, healthcare, etc.			
Safety	Research the area's safety, lighting, and secure door/window locks.			
Public Transport & Parking	Check for nearby public transport routes or parking options.

Gas Safety Certificate	Request to see a valid gas safety certificate.			
Electrical Safety Certificate	Ensure the property has an up-to- date electrical safety certificate.			
Smoke & CO Alarms	Check that there are smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in the property.

Multiple Viewings	Visit the property more than once at different times of the day.			
Photographs & Notes	Take photos and notes during your viewings for future reference.			
Questions to Ask the Landlord/Agent				
Landlord Experience	Ask how long the property has been rented to students.			
Maintenance Response Time	Clarify how long it takes to address repairs.			
Reporting Issues	Learn the process for reporting maintenance or repair issues.			
Guarantor Requirement	Check if a guarantor is needed for the rental agreement.
